From April through the third week of September 2025, we reached communities across 20 states and 54 districts affected by cloudbursts, fires, floods, landslides, and conflict. Working with local team members, grassroots volunteers, and partners, we channelised over 34,000 immediate relief kits and essential materials to Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Manipur, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal.

Need-Based Material Intervention

Each region faces unique challenges. Our relief efforts go beyond one-size-fitsall solutions, adopting a diversified approach that assists communities not just survive, but bring them back to their livelihoods with dignity and moving toward self-reliance. Apart from need-based comprehensive relief kits, specific material includes sleeping bags for the cold areas in Jammu and Kashmir; stationery, books, and toys for the camps in Manipur; and tarpaulins, mattresses, and trunks in Delhi.

The Goonj Way: Building a Resilient Response

Relief must go beyond survival. We reach out to affected people with immediate relief but also stay with the community even when media attention wanes, enabling communities throughout the process of rehabilitation, mitigation, and building long-term resilience.



Strengthening Community Access with people-

NC Letua village, Lakhimpur, Assam: Under Goonj's <u>Cloth For Work</u> initiative, the community built a bamboo bridge. Annual floods previously cut them off from markets, neighboring villages, and paddy fields. Using shared time, local bamboo, and binding wire, villagers created more than infrastructure — they built hope and a lifeline for their community.



Kulhachada village, Baleswar, Odisha: Located on the Subarnarekha River banks near the sea, this farming and fishing community faced daily flooding when sea tides overflowed into clogged canals. Through collective effort mobilized by Goonj, they cleared the canal. Now, tidal water drains and nearby villages inspired by them are adopting similar initiatives.




The Way Forward
